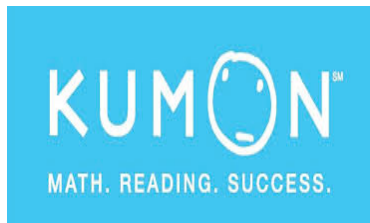

Hale O Ulu is a “second chance” for students who are referred by their school administration for suspensions of inappropriate behavior that range from drug abuse, insubordination, and possession of weapons. Hale O Ulu Staff is trained to practice a trauma-informed care approach that will be able to build a trusting relationship in a safe environment that will foster a positive change in the lives of HOU students. This helps the student to address more than just their educational issues and have the support to be successful as they return to high schools and intermediate schools. The program partners with the Department of Education (DOE) to transition the student to the HOU setting and provide the student with the opportunity to work on current curriculum from the home school while in the program.

Eligibility: Individuals grades 7-12 that have been identified by the Department of Education or Family Court. Students are referred to Hale O Ulu by their school administrators or probation officer.

High School students from Wai`anae and Nanakuli who were not able to function in a regular classroom environment came to the land to learn how to care about themselves through the caring of the land, using traditional Hawaiian values.

Services Description:

Ho’ohuli addresses the at-risk factors that impact adolescents and adults: poverty, lack of higher education and limited career options. Ho’ohuli, KEY’s Competency-based High School Diploma Program (CBHSP) began as a collaboration between KEY, the State Department of Education (DOE)-Windward School for Adults (WSA) and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA)to establish an alternative High School Diploma program for Native Hawaiian youth and adults 16 or older.

The Competency-Based Community School Diploma Program (CBCSDP) consists of five units emphasizing the development of an adult’s ability to apply life skills to cope with society’s requirements. Students must complete two required phases in order to qualify for a Hawaii Adult Community School Diploma:

Phase 1: The Academic Section: Students study five academic general knowledge areas: Consumer Economics; Community Resources; Government & Law; Health; Occupational Knowledge. Students are required to: Attend at least 75% of the total class sessions per unit; Complete assigned tasks for each unit and submit a portfolio; Take a unit test for each of the 5 units and score 70% or higher; Take the CBCSDP Mastery Test and score 70% or higher.

Phase II: The Career Phase: Students are required to complete and provide documentation for one of the following choices: Complete a minimum of one credit at an accredited post-secondary institution; Be employed or perform community service for a minimum 100 hours over a 3 month period with the same organization; Obtain or possess a marketable skill (job training program).

Upon successful completion of both (with a final mastery test), students receive a formal Hawaii Adult Community School Diploma issued by the State of Hawaii Department of Education.

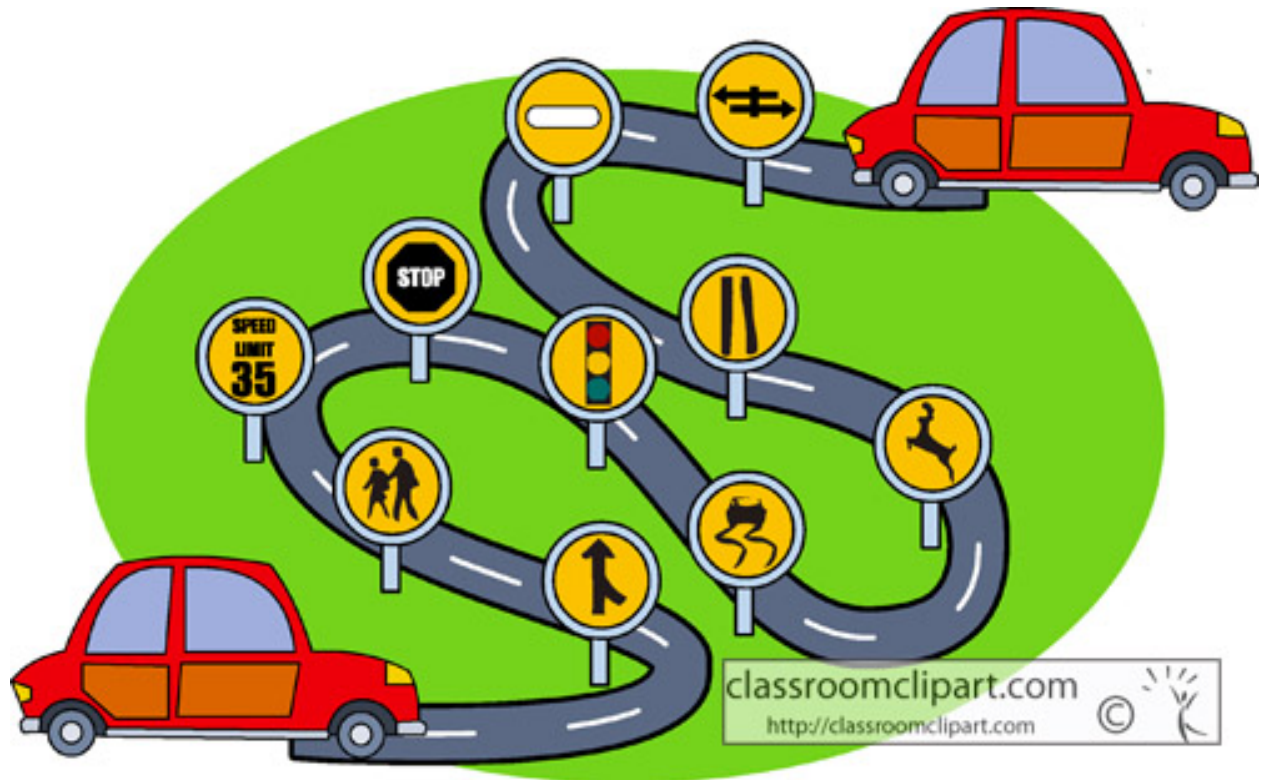

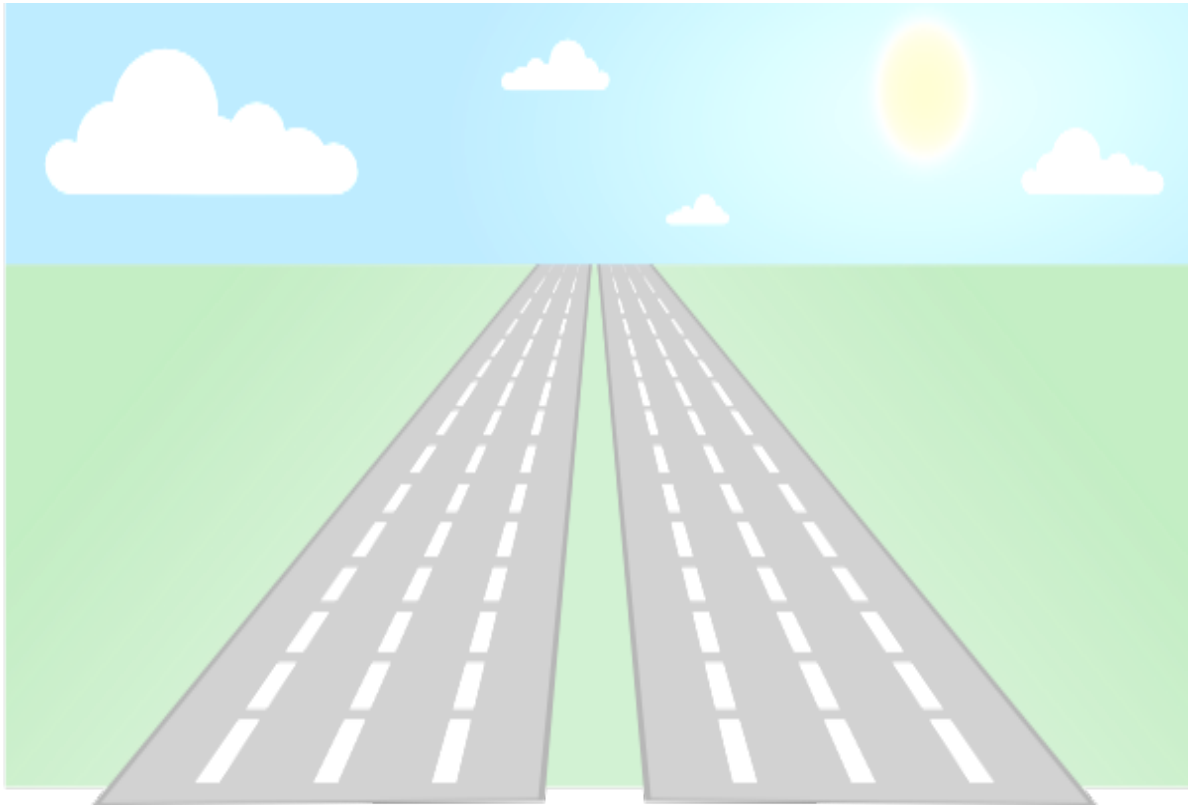

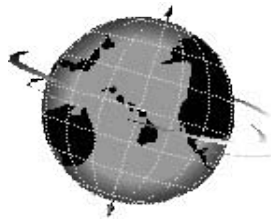
