

Housing

Most elder adults prefer to age-in-place and many are able to live in their own homes with support (see **Family Support**). Others may choose or find it necessary to live with others or move to another type of dwelling. Housing needs and options for the elderly vary greatly. For independent seniors, there are retirement residences/communities and low-income senior housing. These units have minimum age restrictions, which typically range from 55 for retirement residences to 62 for low-income senior rentals.

For those who need help with activities of daily living, options include getting **in-home assistance** or residing in an Adult Residential Care Home (ARCH) or Assisted Living Residence. For those with greater needs, entry to a Skilled Nursing or Intermediate Care Facility (also known as nursing homes), Expanded ARCH, or Foster Family Home, may be necessary. Home Improvement

Residential Care Homes and Foster Homes Adult Residential Care Homes

(ARCH), Expanded ARCH, and Foster Family Homes provide shelter, supervision, and care for persons needing help with daily living activities. ARCH and Expanded ARCH are regulated and licensed by the State Department of Health Office of Health Care Assurance. There are over 400 licensed ARCHs and Expanded ARCHs on Oahu. Most are private homes in residential communities licensed for up to 5 persons. A few of them are large facilities with many residents. Some offer specialized care; such as for persons with Alzheimer's disease. Costs vary greatly depending on amenities and amount of care provided. When choosing an ARCH it is a good idea to interview the caregivers and residents, observe the condition of the physical and social environment, understand the rules on visiting hours, etc. You should also ask the ARCH operator for the most recent survey/inspection findings done by the Department of Health. For assistance in choosing an ARCH, see *Case Management*. For concerns about a facility, see the *Long Term Care Ombudsman*, 586-7268.

Foster Family Homes, also known as Residential Alternatives to Community Care Program (RACC) homes, are regulated by the State Department of Human Services. Placement into a Foster Family Home must be done through a Department of Human Services contracted case management agency. Retirement and Assisted Living Residences

Retirement residences are for independent living, often with amenities such as housekeeping and dining rooms. Assisted Living residences add the component of intermittent personal care. Some facilities offer special dementia units and skilled nursing care facilities on the premises. Units in some facilities such as Olaloa Retirement Community and One Kalakaua Senior Living are bought and sold by individuals. Contact a realtor for assistance in purchasing these units.

The following providers offer non-emergency curb-to-curb service. **Curb-to-curb** service is pick up and drop off only. Some may offer door-to-door, escort or other services. **Door-to-door** service includes assistance between vehicle and building entrance, usually for passengers who are frail or use a wheelchair. Some medical transportation providers also accommodate gurneys and stretchers and may accept Medicaid for qualified medical appointments; these services are non-emergency transportation only.

Family Support

This section describes programs and services that promote quality of life by supplementing the care for frail elders that is generally provided by families. If you help a friend or family member with trips to the doctor or grocery store, or help with their grooming or household chores, then you are a family caregiver.

People often think of nursing homes when they hear the term long-term care (LTC). However, LTC includes any type of ongoing service a person would need to maintain quality of life, including assistance provided in the home by family members or agencies. Medical insurance (such as Medicare) will usually only cover skilled nursing care for a very limited time. LTC insurance may cover additional skilled nursing care and custodial care, which includes assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, dressing, and toileting. Case Management

Case managers help with coordinating care for the needs of a frail or disabled elderly person. They develop care plans based on individual needs, coordinate service delivery, and monitor progress. Some also specialize in helping elders get placed into long-term care facilities. It is a good option for long distance caregivers and those who have limited time.

Case managers may be Licensed Social Workers (LSW), Registered Nurses (RN), etc. It is common practice to ask for qualifications when looking to hire one. Also look for "Home Health Service" in the Yellow Pages for other private companies.

Respite - Adult Day Care and Day Health

Adult Day Care programs include supervision, recreation, socialization, exercise, meals, and group activities. Facilities are licensed by the Department of Human Services, Adult and Community Care Services Branch. Most centers require participants to be 55 years or older, ambulatory, continent, a non-wanderer, non-combative, able to eat independently and transfer with little or no assistance. Some provide additional assistance or special services, usually for an added cost.

Adult Day Health programs are for those who require a higher level of care, usually intermediate care facility (ICF) level. Services could include health assessments, administration of medication, or care coordination. There may also be specialized care such as programs for dementia patients. Adult Day Health Centers are staffed with Registered Nurses who are qualified to dispense medication and provide skilled nursing level care. Facilities are licensed by the Department of Health, Office of Health Care Assurance. These facilities require TB and medical clearance (physical exam). Some providers will suggest a trial period if they are unsure your family member is appropriate for their program.



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In-Home Assistance

It is sometimes difficult for older adults to accept in-home assistance. They may not want strangers in their home, deny the need, or believe that accepting help means the next step is a nursing home. However, this assistance may delay or avoid institutionalization, allowing them to remain at home longer. Assistance in the home comes in various forms. Traditionally, most care is provided by relatives, friends, and neighbors. However, this "informal" care may need supplementing.

"Formal" assistance is provided by non-profit organizations, privately hired independent providers (nurses, therapists, aides, homemakers and companions), home care agencies, home health agencies and government programs. Home health agencies typically provide more medically oriented services than home care agencies. Medicare covers only certain in-home services for a limited period of time; not long-term care. When hospitalized, talk to the doctor, and ask to speak to the social worker or discharge planner to identify the family's role in caring for the patient at home and services available. Medicaid clients should contact their plan provider to see if they are eligible for service covered under their plan. 
Home Health Agencies

Home health agencies provide skilled nursing services and other therapeutic services ordered by a physician to homebound patients. A home health agency can be Medicare and/or Medicaid certified which means that they can provide services that are covered by Medicare and/or Medicaid. Medicare certification is voluntary. State licensing of home health agencies by the Office of Healthcare Assurance is required. Home care agencies provide custodial services, which are non-medical such as housekeeping, meal preparation and ongoing assistance with personal care. The Department of Health must license each home health agency and the agency requires each agency systematic evaluation of its program and a periodic evaluation of employee performance on the basis of standards acceptable to the department.

Evaluation of the home health agency's program is usually done at least once every two years. The method of program evaluation includes a review of patients' records on a sample basis to determine that the services are being used appropriately, and the extent to which the needs of the patients are being met. Hawaii Medicare-certified programs are surveyed annually against the Medicare Conditions of Participation.

Not all home care agency services are covered by Medicare; services are private pay. Some home health agencies provide only Medicare covered services while others will provide private duty services. For private services, most agencies have a 2-4 hour minimum per visit and the care recipient must receive ongoing services, typically a minimum of once or twice a week. Some offer live-in care and travel assistance/escort. When looking for any agency that provides employees who work in your home, it is common practice to inquire what kind of safeguards they have established to prevent adverse events, like insurance, bonding, background checks, accreditation, and certifications. Listed below are licensed Home Health Agencies on Oahu.

Medicare and Medicaid

Medicare is a federal health insurance plan available to seniors, 65 years and older, and certain people with disabilities. It does not pay for all medical costs. Beneficiaries are responsible for deductibles, co-pays, premiums, and non-covered services. Medicare does not pay for long-term care; skilled nursing facility care provided by Medicare is limited to less than 100 days, depending on the beneficiary's condition. Part A, Hospital coverage, limited skilled nursing facility and home health, and hospice - No premium for those who worked longer than 10 years or covered by a spouse. Part B, Doctor visits, outpatient, and other medical care. Part D, Drug coverage - plans and premiums vary. Part C, also referred to as Medicare Advantage Plans, combines Part A and B plans into PPO (Preferred Provider Organization), HMO (Health Maintenance Organization), PFFS (Private Fee for Service), Cost Plans, Special Needs Plans and Medical Savings Accounts. For a description of the plans available in Hawaii, check your current *Medicare and You Handbook*. Each of these plans has their own unique advantages and limitations. Be careful when choosing Part C or D plans as they may affect your other coverages,

Medigap plans are Medicare Supplemental Insurance plans provided by insurance companies to fill the "gaps" in coverage that may not be provided by Original Medicare. Call Sage PLUS (586-7299) if you need help understanding your options and choosing a Medicare plan. It is important to sign up for Medicare as soon as you become eligible. Contact the Social Security Administration three months before you turn 65 or become eligible for Medicare, otherwise you may have to pay a penalty or delay your coverage if you miss your initial enrollment period. Medicaid is a State-administered health insurance program for persons with certain disabilities/medical conditions and persons 65 years and older who have very low incomes and limited assets. In Hawaii, the Medicaid program is operated by the Department of Human Services Med-QUEST Division.

Medical Equipment

Medical equipment also known as durable medical equipment (DME) includes items such as walkers, wheelchairs, and hospital beds. Medicare will cover certain types of DME with a prescription. In some cases, renting DME may be more appropriate than purchasing. Renting is also covered under Medicare. Consult with a Sage PLUS (586-7299) counselor to see what would be best for your situation. In most cases, once you purchase DME using your Medicare benefit, you may be responsible for repairs and/or replacement. Be sure to get information in writing on warranty coverage BEFORE purchasing the equipment. To find a DME supplier, look in the Yellow Pages under "Medical Equipment" or "Medical Supplies" and ask if they accept Medicare. You can also call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) to speak to a Medicare representative. Look for dealers that accept "assignment" which means they accept Medicare's payment amount as payment in full (not including plan co-payment). Ask friends, social workers, and medical professionals for advice and referrals. Call Sage PLUS for additional information.
