

STD Testing and Services

- Services at the Diamond Head Health Center STD Clinic are offered on a free, walk-in basis. Specially trained healthcare providers are available for evaluation, testing and treatment for common sexually transmitted diseases such as syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, non-gynoccocal urethritis (NGU), and vaginal infections (trichomoniasis, bacterial vaginosis, yeast).
- In addition, individualized STD patient education, counseling, and confidential partner notification and treatment services are available.

Hepatitis Testing and Services

 Hepatitis B and/or C testing is available to eligible patients after they have completed a risk history, and had an STD or HIV testing.

HIV Partner Services

Partner Services is a voluntary prevention activity for persons who are living with HIV and their sex and needle-sharing partners, with the goals of:

- prevention of HIV transmission to uninfected partners
- helping partners get earlier access to individualized counseling, HIV testing, medical treatment, and other prevention activities
- Specially trained counselors discuss the different ways sex and needle-sharing
 partners can be informed of possible exposure to HIV without revealing the identity
 of the person with HIV. This service is available to those diagnosed through the
 STD/HIV Clinic, as well as those under the care of a private physician.

Gregory House Programs is committed to the ongoing assessment and development of programs that meet the housing needs of persons living with HIV/ AIDS throughout Hawaii, because housing is healthcare. Our deepest hope is for a cure for HIV, the end of homelessness, and the day when Gregory House Programs will no longer be needed. Until then, Gregory House Programs will continue to do whatever is needed to ease the impact on those who have been infected and affected with HIV/AIDS. The housing programs help more than 270 individuals and families annually, and the food program feeds more than 325 annually.

Transitional Housing

Gregory House, our first program (pictured), has 11 beds for eligible persons who are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless. There are in-house classes, group activities, and intensive staff support. Participants may stay up to two years while they work on issues that affect stability, gain skills, and set goals towards independent housing.

Emergency Housing

Temporary Shelter is provided to homeless persons for up to two weeks at a YMCA or economy hotel, while they work with their case managers to secure more permanent housing.

Emergency Assistance provides grants toward housing costs to end or prevent homelessness, such as security deposit or past due rent, utility, or mortgage.

Rental Assistance

Several subsidy programs allow participants and their families to live independently in private rented units. Assisted units must be within the fair market rent limit and pass housing inspections. Generally, participants pay a portion of their household income towards rent and the program pays the remainder.

Nutrition

The **Foodbasket** program delivers food to those who are house bound or in rural areas and distributes groceries at a rented space in a centrally located church. All recipients get an equal amount of frozen meats, fresh produce, dairy, and canned and dried goods. Hot lunch is also served twice a week to all who need it. Other services include limited toiletries and cleaning supplies, nutrition classes, nutrition counseling, and other skills classes.

Case Management

Comprehensive case management is provided to all clients; our housing case managers work with clients to secure housing or maintain housing, to be more self-sufficient and independent, and to deal with issues that would affect stability. Services include eligibility assessment, housing inspection, budgeting, developing housing case plans, rent calculations, home visits, on-going assessments of needs, referrals, annual certifications, landlord mediations, etc.

Welcome to the Hawai'l Center for AIDS (HICFA) website. We are part of the University Of Hawai'l John A. Burns School Of Medicine. HICFA is an academic program in HIV with clinical, translational, and laboratory research studies in HIV and a clinic providing care to HIV infected patients. HICFA includes the Hawai'l AIDS Clinical Trials Unit (HACTU), 2 research laboratories – Hawai'l HIV Immunobiology and Vaccine Laboratory (HHIVL) and the Clint Spencer Clinic.

The Hawai'i Department of Health provides the HIV medical management services to help people living with HIV and their doctors to monitor and maintain their health. Services are provided through three programs: HSPAMM, HDAP, and H-COBRA.

Hawai'i Seropositivity & Medical Management Program (HSPAMM) and Link-to-Care

HSPAMM's "Link-to-Care" services are for individuals who are HIV positive, live in Hawai'i, and might be at risk for foregoing or postponing routine medical visits and/or lab work (e.g., for reasons such as cost). The aim of Link-to-Care services is to support HIV positive individuals in accessing and remaining in medical care. Link-to-Care provides access to a routine panel of HIV-related laboratory tests (including T-cell counts and viral load tests) that are essential in monitoring the health of individuals living with HIV. The routine panel can be repeated every six months, or more frequently if needed. In addition to the routine panel of tests, Link-to-Care also provides access to lab tests, such as for HIV drug resistance, which may periodically be necessary for effective management of HIV. If a patient lacks insurance coverage to pay for the physician's office visits in conjunction with lab testing, payment through HSPAMM may be arranged. Link-to-Care services are provided at no cost to the patient.

Who is eligible for HSPAMM/Link-to-Care? Anyone who is HIV positive, living in Hawai'i, and faces barriers accessing routine doctor visits and laboratory testing is eligible.

How does someone start getting HSPAMM/Link-to-Care services? All Hawai'i residents living with HIV who might otherwise skip routine visits or laboratory tests are strongly encourage to take advantage of these free services to monitor and help manage their health. Patients need to be enrolled by their physician. Physicians can call HSPAMM at (808) 733-9360 (Honolulu number) to get new patient enrollment packets.

HIV Drug Assistance Program (HDAP)

HDAP provides medication to Hawai'i residents living with HIV, who have limited income and who cannot get HIV medications for any other sources, or need assistance with insurance-related costs (such as co-pays and deductibles) for HIV medications. There is no cost to the patient to participate in HDAP.

HDAP provides FDA-approved medications used to:

- Treat HIV infection
- Prevent and treat opportunistic infections
- Treat HIV-associated anemia and wasting
- Treat or improve side effects of HIV
- Treat co-occurring conditions

The drugs that can be provided by HDAP are listed on the HPAD Formulary 2014

Who is eligible for HDAP? To be eligible for HDAP, an individual must:

- · Live in Hawai'i
- Be HIV positive
- Be ineligible for Medicaid
- Lack prescription drug insurance, or need assistance with the cost of accessing medications under insurance
- Have family income not more than 400% of the Federal Poverty Level for Hawaiii
 (2014: \$53,680 per year for a single person; 72,360 per year for a family of two)
- Be enrolled in the case management program of one of the agencies funded by the state to provide HIV casse management

How does someone apply for HDAP? Applications for HDAP are handled through agencies that partner with the Department of Health to provide HIV Case Management. The case management agency is required to maintain documentation to support eligibility, including documentation of residence, family income, and insurance. Clients receiving HDAP services must be recertified through the case management agency every six months to maintain eligibility in HDAP.

Hawai'i Insurance Continuation Program (H-COBRA)

In some situations, H-COBRA can pay health insurance premiums on behalf of an eligible individual. Hawaii residents living with HIV who need assistance affording their health insurance premiums should work with their HIV case manager to determine whether H-COBRA assistance is an option.

Examples of some requirements for H-COBRA to be able to pay health insurance premiums:

- The insurer must accept third-party payment.
- H-COBRA must make payment directly to the insurer or insurance administrator. H-COBRA is prohibited from making payment of any kind to an individual (client, participant, insured person, etc) and therefore cannot *reimburse* for payments made by an individual.
- The client must be able to provide adequate documentation of the required payment (such as a bill from the insurer).
- The insurance must include adequate coverage for prescription medications.
- H-COBRA is a "payer of last resort" and cannot pay for services that can reasonably be expected to be covered by another payer.

Who is eligible for H-COBRA? To be eligible for H-COBRA, an individual must:

- Live in Hawai'i
- Be HIV positive
- Be ineligible for Medicaid
- Be eligible to purchase insurance that meets H-COBRA guidelines and for which payment arrangements can be established
- Have family income not more than 400% of the Federal Poverty Level for Hawai'i (2014: \$53,680 per year for a single person; 72,360 per year for a family of two)

How does someone apply for H-COBRA? Contact the HIV Case Management on your island for assistance applying for H-COBRA. The case management agency is required to maintain documentation to support eligibility, including documentation of residence, family income, and insurance. Clients receiving H-COBRA services must be recertified through the case management agency every six months to maintain eligibility in H-COBRA.

The Hawai'i Island HIV/AIDS Foundation, a duly registered 501(c)3 non-profit corporation, was established through a merger of the Big Island AIDS Project and the West Hawai'i AIDS Foundation on September 15, 2003, and provides island-wide coordination of services to all persons affected by HIV/AIDS.

Our Mission

The Hawai'i Island HIV/AIDS Foundation is a nonprofit organization dedicated to building a healthier, stronger community with an emphasis on HIV and related health issues.

Services Provided:

Mental Health Counseling

Most people experience shock and anxiety when they find out they have HIV. Counseling can help reduce these feelings as well as provide support and guidance as a client deals with his/her illness. HIHAF provides a full range of outpatient mental health and substance abuse services, including individual, family, relationship sessions with a licensed clinician. Our trained case management team members assist clients in adjusting to a life with HIV/AIDS and in taking steps towards proper medical treatment.

Treatment Advocates and Benefits Specialist

HIHAF clients are evaluated to find out what their needs are and how best to meet those needs. Case management is client centered. Case managers act as the coordinator for the care and social needs of their clients. They link clients with medical services and provide support and referrals to other services as needed. HIHAF case managers also assist with housing assistance, establishing medical treatment and drug assistance and adherence, mental health and addiction services.

Food Pantry

Registered clients with HIV/AIDS are eligible to shop in the food pantry. This service is supplemental to food they would purchase at the grocery store. Each client must be in medical care, adhere to prescribed medical treatments and demonstrate financial need. When clients are "shopping" our case managers have an opportunity to assess their physical condition. Food bank hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30p.m. in Kona and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00p.m. in Hilo, Monday through Friday.

Insurance Assistance Program

Benefit Specialist are able to refer those clients in need to HCOBRA and HDAP, state run programs that those unable to work to remain enrolled in the current private insurance program, receive prescription medicine and maintain continuous medical treatment. These programs prevent a lapse in care, allowing clients to continue treatment through their private physician and avoid any disruption in medical adherence. HIHAF case managers assist with enrollment in these programs and supervision during post enrollment.

Housing Assistance

Through funding from Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS (HOPWA), eligible clients with emergency housing needs can be assisted with short-term rent payments.

Legal Assistance

Benefits specialist are able to make referrals legal services should the need arise.

Professional Education

HIHAF staff is available for HIV/Hepatitis C and other health-related training for the professional community.

Special Community Awareness Events

HIHAF receives requests from many groups to participate in awareness events by setting up a booth or table to distribute information and answer questions about HIV/ AIDS. HIHAF observes National Testing Day, National API AIDS Awareness Day, and World AIDS Day with special events throughout the island.

• Testing + Prevention + Outreach

HIHAF offers free and anonymous rapid HIV and Hep C screening, with results in 20 minutes. Our outreach specialists are also trained counselor/testers and meet those at risk for HIV "where they are" — in places such as homeless shelters, community health clinics, bars, and other areas. In addition, our counselor testers link people determined to be HIV+ to care so that they can get the resources they need as soon as possible.

Free and anonymous HIV rapid testing (results in 20 minutes) is available in the Kona and Hilo offices on a walk-in basis

School & Workplace Education

HIHAF provides prevention education and intervention activities in either individual or group settings in schools or the workplace. Education includes information about HIV and STD risk, harm reduction, counseling and prevention.

Mission Statement

Injection drug users represent the second highest numbers of AIDS cases. In response to this crisis, Kû Aloha recognizes the critical position it is in to help stop AIDS in Hawaii and to advocate for adequate provision of services by the social services system for HIV infected drug users. Therefore, Kû Aloha is also committed to direct its expertise to community education, leadership, advocacy and competent, compassionate care and treatment of substance abusing populations, their sexual partners and their families.

Target population

The programs serves adults and adolescents who are participants in drug and alcohol treatment programs that are purchase of service providers of the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division of the Department of Health. The programs are located on Oahu, the Big Island, Maui and Kauai.

Program description

The EIS program provides on- site nursing, education and counseling, and phlebotomy services toward the early detection, prevention of transmission and medical case management related to HIV and other communicable diseases. Early detection includes risk assessment and HIV testing.

Services

A group education session is held with all participants. Those who wish to be tested for HIV will meet individually with an EIS worker for a pretest counseling session. The same worker will return with the test results to provide post-test counseling and results. Once someone has been identified as having HIV, medical case management is initiated for as long as the need for services exist.

HIV Care Services:

Life Foundation is the link to the AIDS care system on Oahu. People living with HIV can face a number of challenges while finding out what community and government services are available to them. At Life Foundation, experienced case managers guide our HIV-positive clients through this process, and help them access existing resources such as medical care, housing assistance, financial benefits, and mental health services.

Case Management

The primary goal of case management is to ensure a safe place for HIV-positive people on Oahu to receive the support they need to live with and ultimately survive AIDS. Life Foundation clients are assigned to case managers who provide services such as counseling, housing assistance, and support.

The Honolulu Clinic offers the following services related to the testing and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs):

- STD testing, diagnosis and treatment, including:
 - o Bacterial Vaginosis (BV) o Chlamydia o Genital warts o Gonorrhea
 - Herpes
 - HIV (testing and diagnosis only)
 - Syphilis Trichomoniasis (trich)
- STD prevention, including: condoms female condoms dental dams HPV vaccine (Gardasil) STD/safer sex education
- STD testing, vaccines and treatment services are available during all business hours by appointment

Here's what you need to know about STD testing and treatment at this health center:


- We can test for gonorrhea and chlamydia using a urine sample. If this test shows an infection, then we will provide you with treatment and explain how your partner(s) can be treated.
- For testing involving urine samples, including chlamydia and gonorrhea, do not urinate or engage in sexual intercourse for one hour before testing.
- Many STD tests require a genital exam.
- Rapid HIV testing can be done with a blood sample taken from a finger stick.
 The results are available in 10-40 minutes.
- Counseling and confidential (private) testing for STDs are provided by trained staff who are sensitive to your needs and concerns.
- Individuals ages 19 26 who have no health insurance and meet financial criteria may qualify for the Merck Vaccine Patient Assistance Program to receive the HPV vaccine (Gardasil) at no charge. Other fees may apply.
- Some vaccines are given in a series over the course of several months, which would require you to return to the health center to get the full benefit.

Walk-In Services:

Emergency contraception, pregnancy tests, HOPE visits, DMPA re-shots, STD/HIV testing and supply pickups. All other services require appt. If you need emergency contraception (morning after pill) you can walk-in anytime the health center is open. Walk-in patients are seen on a first come first serve basis. Patients with appointments may be seen before a walk-in patient.

Payment Information:

If you are uninsured, you may qualify for a state funded program or a lower fee scale. Fees for services are based on your household income.
